I'M NOT SURE IF I AM GRADUATING, WHAT SHOULD I DO?

IF CIRCUMSTANCES CHANGE AND I CAN/CANNOT ATTEND WHO DO I NOTIFY?

Complete another RSVP (if available) or inform your academic area. For accommodation, please call and talk to Kaitiaki. Graduating students may not appear in the printed graduation book if they are not confirmed as eligible to graduate before the book goes to print the week prior to graduation.

CAN SOMEONE ELSE RECEIVE MY TAONGA ON BEHALF OR IF I AM UNABLE TO ATTEND?

Taonga are a gift from the three founding Iwi of Te Wānanga o Raukawa, only those who attend the graduation ceremony receive their taonga.

If there are extenuating circumstances that are beyond the control of a graduating student being able to attend (tangihana, māuiuitanga etc), they may provide evidence and tono to their academic Kaihautū with details including information of the person who will be receiving the taonga and tohu on their behalf. The Tumuaki or Pou Akoranga have the final approval for these tono. Please make contact with your academic whare in the first instance.

AM I ABLE TO CHOOSE WHICH PRESENTATION I AM ATTENDING?

No. Presentation times are organised by whare to ensure the day runs smoothly and each group of graduates can be celebrated fully with their whānau and the wider Wānanga whānau.

WHERE DO I CHANGE MY PERSONAL DETAILS?

Any change of details to legal names (with evidence), contact details and Iwi must be completed through the Te Ara enrolment portal. All information populated for communications, the graduation book and on stage are taken from your student record provided from your enrolment. Only students can change their details. The date to receive name and iwi changes for the printed book is Weds 26 November.

HOW DO I UPDATE MY IWI DETAILS FOR GRADUATION?

As an act of manaakitanga for all graduating students, there are only three Iwi/Hapū that are printed in the graduation book, presented on screen and on the MC list. Details are taken from student records as completed in the Te Ara enrolment portal. It is recommended that students ensure they

recognise those Iwi/Hapū who have supported them in their studies. If a student has six iwi, it will be the first three that are recognised. Please ensure you keep your Te Ara details up to date. The date to receive name and iwi changes for the printed book is Weds 26 November.

I HAVEN'T RECEIVED ANY INFORMATION ABOUT GRADUATION, WHERE DO I GO?

Invitations and communications about graduation are sent out to students' personal email and/or mobile number as indicated on your enrolment form. Please check your 'junk' folder. All information is added to the graduation webpage including a link to the RSVP and important information. Remember to keep your details up to date in the Te Ara enrolment portal.

I'VE JUST LEARNT I'M GRADUATING, IS IT TOO LATE TO ATTEND?

For students who have completed days prior and are unable to access the RSVP form, please contact your academic kaikōkiri and come on the day. Check in with the marshalling area when advised according to the graduation programme. Your name will not be in the printed graduation book but can be added to the MC list and presented on stage.

I'M GRADUATING WITH TWO SEPARATE QUALIFICATIONS WHAT SHOULD I EXPECT?

Students graduating with two qualifications, and from separate whare will walk the stage twice as per the order of ceremony. Please contact your [academic whare](#) for advice and confirmation.
