

### Glossary of Terms

Academic Area	Refers to one of the three components of study at Te Wānanga o Raukawa. Specialist Studies, Iwi and Hapū Studies or Te Reo Studies.

Programme of study	The selection of courses a student is enrolled into in one academic year. Can also refer to the sum total of courses over one or a number of years to achieve a tohu.

Programme Schedule	A calendar of academic year including the total courses required to achieve a programme of study in a tohu, dates when attendance or online activity is required, assessment due dates and assessment return dates.
